

Tragedy to Blessing .. A Joyful Rescue

"I'm getting 28 parakeets tomorrow". They were coming from a bird friend who was moving.

I released the parakeets into an empty flight. They were all pretty, colorful like parakeets are. Then I noticed one bird was missing a foot. I looked at the rest and found that eight of the 15 parakeets had no feet or one foot.

My heart sank. It was blue jays that done it. I'd seen it before. They come up under a cage and bite the feet off of baby birds. The babies could fly with the rest and could land on a perch but they would never breed and I couldn't sell a handicapped bird. I have a couple of finches that are handicapped in the finch flight, but I couldn't keep eight parakeets. I didn't have cage space.

I put them in a cage with a covered bottom and just kept them in the aviary. I was heartbroken and couldn't think of what to do with them.

Then Allie dropped by to see the birds. I told her about the feet as we were looking at them. She hadn't seen it yet. I could read her face as thoughts raced. At first a little shocked, then thinking what could be done for them. We watched for a long time. Then she said in a rush "I'll take them, all of them".

She wanted to tame them so we clipped their wings. It seemed wrong to take flight from them, but the feathers will grow back and they will tame. I told her to put them where the family was and to talk to them.

"They're all letting me hold them and they're so sweet and soft and cuddly. We adore them!" followed my hello the next morning. Her two kids, aged 10 and 2 took to the birds right away as did the dog. Even her husband admitted they were pretty cute.

She called today and said they had gotten a rodent habitat, with ramps and solid floors. So their new little family of 8 baby parakeets will have a home that fits them.
